II. Details of the activities

1. **DFMC Bi-Monthly Meeting 2 and 3** - have been submitted as separate reports with detailed MoM.

2. **Student Interns** -

DFMC recruited 20 student interns from Kakatiya PG college. All students were second year MSW graduates. The interns were first sensitized to the subject and were then guided and instructed for their work of 45 days. Mr. Abhilash and Mr. Kiran Kumar Sen were two guest faculty who took the training for them alongwith DFMC staff.

3. Pilot Water Survey

A brainstorming session was conducted by DFMC with DC, EE-RWSS, CEO-ZP, DPO, external water quality experts, FKAN to plan methodology and tools to conduct the survey. A questionnaire was then developed and action plan drawn. The pilot water survey was for a week. Interns were divided into 2 large groups. Each group had 10 interns and they had to live in the habitations for with the community. 3 days in first habitation and 3 days in the next habitation. some of the findings from the survey are

June 15-17, 2017	G.P – Nermata Hab – Nermata Mandal -	6.8 ppm. 420 HH. 1600 pop School – RO for Drinking water, bore water for cooking RO Plant set up by Police Dept, but insufficient Few villagers consuming groundwater through GP supply suffer from joint pains, cervical pains etc
June 15-17, 2017	G.P – Kothularam Hab - Kothularam Mandal -	4.56 ppm

The survey results were presented to DC and EE-RWSS and the necessary action was taken immediately. The interns also pasted a copy of the community's contacts of AE, waterman and DFMC team for future queries or fixing small problems w.r.t drinking water. The schools and anganwadis of these habitations were sensitized by the student interns. Sarpanches were encouraged to take this as a priority and ensure safe drinking water to these institutions.

4. Health camps

Marriguda was discussed to be the focus point in the second bi-monthly meeting. Keeping this agenda in mind, DFMC organized health camps at GP level to ensure no patient is aloof from the benefits they're entitled to, including medical procedures.

14 camps were held in Marriguda Mandal. These camps were specifically for Fluorosis identification only. Health department and Kamineni Hospitals, Narketpally were the partners.
