**POLY HOUSE ON 75% SUBSIDY:**

**Objectives:**

- To enhance productivity per unit area.
- Promotion of high value Horticulture crops under Poly houses.
- Year round production of Vegetable crops especially for off season production of vegetables.
- Disease free and genetically superior transplants can be produced continuously, there by generation of livelihoods in rural areas.

**FLAGSHIP PROGRAMME – II : T.S.MICRO IRRIGATION PROJECT (TSMIP)**

**Objectives:**

- All SC/ST Farmer are eligible for 100% subsidy.
- All BC farmers are eligible for 90% subsidy.
- All SF/MF farmers (other than SC/ST) are eligible for 90% subsidy
- All other caste farmers are eligible for 80% subsidy.
- Portable sprinklers for all category farmers are eligible for 75% subsidy limited to 1ha unit only.

**SERICULTURE IN NALGONDA DISTRICT :**

- Mulberry plantation
- Sericulture is sustainable agro based crop.
- Provides rural employment and continuous income.
- Mulberry plant is perannual and gives yield for 15 to 20 years and regular returns from 5 to 6 crops in a year.
- One acre Mulberry provides employment to 5 persons throught the year with 60% women involvement.

- Technical Service Centres: The Technical Service Centres will extend the technical guidance to the Sericulture farmers in Mulberry cultivation and Silkworm rearing.
- Net income of Rs.1.50 to 2.00 lakhs to be generated by one acre of Mulberry cultivation.

- For 5 crops in a year on an average Rs.2.00 lakhs can be earned in a year from one acre of Mulberry plantation.
- In Nalgonda District two Govt. Seed Farms are existing at Kondamallepally and Chinthapally.

- **Incentives providing by the Department:**

- Rs.100/- per 100 Disease Free Layings of Bivoltine variety. The cost of 100 DFLs is Rs.650/-
- On Bivoltine Cocoons Rs.50/- per Kg. as incentive.
- On Cross Breed Cocoons Rs.20/- per Kg. as incentive.
- For chawkie warms Rs.150/- per 100 Bivoltine DFLs as incentive.

- **Schemes being implemented:**

- **Implementation of M G NREGS Scheme to the Sericulture farmers**

Under the scheme for maintenance of Mulberry garden for three years will be covered towards labour and material component to the eligible farmer under NREGS.
